

You Don't Know Jack Essay Prompts

After viewing the movie *You Don't Know Jack*, answer one of the following prompts in a five-paragraph essay:

1. How does Dr. Kevorkian fit the hero or a villain archetype? Use evidence from the film to support your answer.
2. Which is more important – the ending of a person's suffering or the continuation of a God-given life? How did viewing this film contribute to your opinion?
3. Draw a comparison between the film "You Don't Know Jack" and the story "Dr. Heidegger's experiment. Are there any similar themes between the two? How might the characters in the story feel about Dr. Kevorkian's work?

Guidelines:

- Be sure to take notes while watching the movie to use as evidence in your essay.
- Make sure you actually use evidence from the movie in your essay. You should use at least one piece of evidence in each body paragraph, and possibly more.
- Include a word count beneath your name.
